


CHEETAH RUN

WHAT'S NEW IN SAN DIEGO

SAN DIEGO IS A VIBRANT, dynamic city with new amenities being added every year. Here are a few new things you can expect.

- · A waterfront park and pedestrian promenade will transform a stretch of land connecting San Diego Bay and downtown into an exciting hub of activity by mid-2013. Just a mile from the Convention Center, plans call for two acres of lush, green park space along with world-class public art, a visitor center, walking paths and gardens. www.portofsandiego.org
- Called The Green Build, the San Diego International Airport is expanding and adding 10 new gates while maintaining sustainability as a guiding principle. It will be LEED Certified Silver when completed in 2013. www.san.org
- Sail across Harbor Drive on a new pedestrian bridge that safely connects the Convention Center with PETCO Park and the Gaslamp Quarter. www.ccdc.com
- Balboa Park is turning 100! Plans are already underway for the 2015 Centennial Celebration, a year-long event bringing together innovative experiences with art, culture, nature, technology and science at the nation's largest urban park. www.balboapark.org

- · Check out SeaWorld's latest attraction, Turtle Reef, a 300,000-gallon aquarium with a massive, underwater viewing area where visitors can get an up-close and personal look at endangered sea turtles. Coming in summer 2012 is Manta, a new roller coaster ride that combines the best of sea and sky. www.seaworldparks.com
- · Go waltzing matilda at Prebys Australian Outback, the new home for koalas and other Australian wildlife at the San Diego Zoo. Opening in 2013. www.sandiegozoo.org

Now one of the nation's hottest new urban areas, our city positively sizzles with excitement

OFFSET BY ONE OF the most beautiful natural harbors in the world, downtown San Diego is one of the nation's hottest new urban areas positively sizzling with excitement.

By day, our historical downtown neighborhoods beckon with their eclectic blend of Victorian and modern architecture, brick sidewalks and sunny outdoor cafes. After dark, these same streets come alive, all promising irresistible dining and entertainment adventures at any of our hip new nightclubs, sleek rooftop bars and superb restaurants.

Best of all, our beautiful waterfront Convention Center is at the heart of all the action. And just a short stroll away there

is a seemingly endless array of stylish hotels, international dining, chic boutiques and specialty shops, high-end nightlife and jazz bars, scenic bay views and many of our must-see attractions.

The historic Gaslamp Quarter, a premier dining, shopping and entertainment district, is located directly across the street from the Convention Center.

PETCO Park, the San Diego Padres' 42,000-seat, state-ofthe-art ballpark, combines the best sight lines in major league baseball with breathtaking downtown views.

The Museum of Contemporary Art San Diego Downtown is a city favorite and just a short walk from Horton Plaza, a unique seven-level, open-air mall. The mall features 130 stores including upscale boutiques, specialty shops, bistros and restaurants.

The USS Midway Museum is an award-winning, interactive, floating museum aboard the longest serving aircraft carrier in U.S. Navy history. Located on the scenic North Embarcadero, it's an unforgettable experience.

The New Children's Museum, is also downtown just across the street from the Convention Center. The museum features innovative, kid-friendly art and activities.

Seaport Village captures the essence of old California and is also just a short stroll away from the Convention Center. This charming, seaside village offers unique shopping, street performers and scenic waterfront paths for walking, biking or jogging.

Additionally there is Embarcadero Marina Park. Comprised of two green "arms", the park reaches into San Diego Bay and embraces the Embarcadero Marina. Just outside the Convention Center's back doors, the arms of the park are connected by a walkway along the shore and around the marina. It's a great place for soaking up San Diego's bay front and sunshine.

Imagine launching off the deck of the USS Midway in a fighter jet going from zero to 150 miles an hour in three seconds! She served the nation for 47 years, from World War II to Desert Storm and is now showcased in San Diego Bay.

Visit the birthplace of California

In 1769, Old Town became California's first permanent Spanish settlement. Today historic museums and shops celebrate San Diego's rich heritage. And it's one of the best places to try authentic Mexican

Balboa Park is home to 15 major museums, nationally-acclaimed performing arts venues, picturesque gardens and the worldfamous San Diego Zoo.

The America is a replica of the first vessel that won the famous America's Cup. The 139-foot schooner can host up to 80 quests and is available for sunset sails, whale watching,

dinners, corporate events and even ocean-going overnight
